Pride

PART I EXPLANATION

Introduction: Of all of the sins, pride appears to be a sin that is most offensive to God. He tells us that He resists the proud. Pride is to have an exalted view of self. The problem with having an exalted view of self is that it is always accompanied by a low view of God. The two have a negative correlation; the higher your views of God, the lower your views of yourself; the higher your views of self, the lower that your views of God will be. Pride is also a very dangerous sin, because it is the sin of not seeing your sin. If we were truly able to view our sins in the light of God's countenance it would certainly serve to give us a greater measure of humility. Ironically, the world has its own way of justifying the sin of pride by changing its name to self esteem.

The majority of people view a high self esteem as a good thing. The reason is that they have false ideas about a low self esteem. A low self esteem is viewed as a bad thing because it has such damaging effects upon an individual. However, calling it low self esteem is just another way of excusing pride. For example, people with a "low self esteem" are usually those who don't like the way they look, act, or especially how others view them. They will frequently make statements like "I hate the way I look, I am so ugly". What this reveals is not that they have a low self esteem, rather that they despise the fact that others don't view them better. If they truly hated themselves, they would be glad that they were ugly. But because they love themselves and despise the fact that others look better than them, they smother themselves in self pity.

Many fail to realize that the root of the problem is pride. It is easy to identify the one who is proud of their talents and appearance and has a haughty spirit. It is not so easy to discover self pride in a ner-do-well. For example, have you ever had the experience of trying to help someone who was in desperate need of help, but in their pride would not allow you to help them? Despite their desperate circumstances their pride refuses assistance. A genuine low self esteem is in reality a very good thing and is something that we are expected to have and develop as Christians. Christ expected us to learn of Him to be "*meek and lowly*". He claimed that in doing so we would find rest for our souls not the bondage of self pity. True meekness is rest for our souls because we do not have to exert ourselves to hold ourselves up in the esteem of others.

It is wrong to view some people as having something to be proud of. In reality, nobody has anything to be proud of. God is the giver of every good and perfect gift. *For who maketh thee to differ from another? And what hast thou that thou didst not receive? Now if thou didst receive it, why dost thou glory, as if thou hadst not receive it?* How indicative of the depravity of man that we would glory over things that we had no control over. No person can control what they look like, who their parents are, or what mental capacity they are given. Nevertheless, those who are born with an attractive countenance, successful parents, and a strong mental capacity are prone to glory in what they have received. God explains that He chooses the foolish, poor, and despised to salvation; that no flesh should glory in His presence. No person will be able to boast of their intellect in deciphering the gospel. All glory is given to Christ for our salvation because it was wholly of grace. How devastating it is to have Christians who are proud of their doctrine, or their church, or their pastor instead of glorying in their Savior and their God.
